

Baildon Moor & Shipley Glen

One of a series of easily accessible countryside sites within the Bradford Metropolitan District.

739 acres (299 hectares) of grassy moorland, including an area of woodland with a stream.

Ideal 'Walking for Health' site.

Due to the very nature of the countryside some areas of the moor may not be suitable for the less mobile and pushchairs. Wheelchair users may be restricted to the access roads to Crook Farm and Dobrudden and along Shipley Glen.

Around Baildon Moor and along Shipley Glen can be found disused quarries, old bell pitts and large outcrops of rocks. Please take care when walking near these features. No climbing or playing nearby.

Please take care when walking near or playing in water. Children should be under close supervision at all times.
