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Bradford Childcare Sufficiency Review 2010

1. Overview

This report summarises key influences on the market for childcare in the Bradford district in 2009-10.

The report:

- Gives details of current relevant local and national childcare initiatives
- Provides updated childcare market statistics

Statistical information has been provided in line with the restructuring of Services for Children and Young People into five geographic localities. Other analysis uses the new 41 children's centre reach areas and the 14 Local Area Partnerships (collaborative school clusters). It should be noted that these changes, in the basis of analysis, make some year-on-year comparisons difficult.

Bradford MDC will be carrying out a comprehensive childcare sufficiency assessment in 2010-11. This work will include a full audit of the district's childcare in June, and consultation with parents, children, childcare providers, employers and other key partners.

2. The Market for Childcare in Bradford 2009-10

2.1 Childcare for Children Aged 0 to 4

The number of daycare providers in the district has increased by 1 to 109, while the number of childminders increased by 21 to 548. The net effect of these changes has been a 2% increase in the total stock of childcare places, with daycare continuing to account for 78% of the district's pre-five provision.

The total number of children aged 0 to 4 remained static at 38,531. This means that the number of childcare places per 100 children increased from 16.3 in 2009 to 18.9 in 2010.

One pre-school playgroup closed during the year leaving a total of 34 pre-school playgroups in the District. 62% of the District's pre-school playgroup places are situated in Keighley and Shipley.

School-based nursery provision accounts for 70% of the District's early education provision. There are, however, significant local variations, for example, school-based provision accounts for 80% of early education places in Bradford North, compared to just 51% in Shipley. 84% of eligible three year olds were accessing their free

entitlement to early education in the autumn term; again there are significant local variations ranging from 77% uptake in Bradford South up to 93% in Shipley.

Childcare for children aged 5+

The number of schools with no linked childcare has increased from 38 to 42 (19% of all schools). There has been an overall reduction in the number of informal breakfast and homework clubs which have reduced from 94 to 83 clubs. There remains a lack of provision linked to secondary schools. Half the District's Secondary Schools lack linked childcare provision.

3. Local and National Influences on the Sufficiency of Childcare in Bradford

3.1 Extension to Early Education Entitlement for Three and Four Year Olds

From September 2010, three and four year old children will be entitled to 15 hours a week free early education. This increased entitlement should be delivered flexibly, where practicable, to meet family needs. The extended offer has already been made available to children from the 25% most disadvantaged areas from September 2009.

A maximum of 10 hours of early education will be funded in any one day. The minimum length of early education sessions will be 2.5 hours. Early education must be provided over a minimum of 38 weeks and funding can be shared between a maximum of two different providers. The universal free Early Education entitlement can be offered over more than 38 weeks in a year, subject to a yearly maximum of 570 hours.

3.2 Early Years Capital Funding

Bradford District has been allocated £7.7m of capital funding by the Department for Children Schools and Families for the period 2008-11. The DCSF requires that the capital grant is spent on the following priorities for young children:

- Improving the quality of the learning environment in early years settings to support delivery of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS: early education and care for children up to age five), with a particular emphasis on improving play and physical activities; and ICT resources
- Ensuring all children, including disabled children, are able to access provision, in-line with local childcare sufficiency assessments
- Enabling providers to deliver the extension to the free early education offer for 3 and 4 year olds and to do so flexibly

The funding is intended to be spent primarily on the private, voluntary and independent (PVI) sectors. An assessment of need has been undertaken with existing PVI providers delivering EYFS and grant applications for funding are almost complete. Provision has also been made to support capital requirements for identified gaps in the childcare market.

3.3 Funded 2 years old places

Bradford has been a pilot authority for early education for 2-year-olds since 2006. The programme is intended to increase the numbers of vulnerable children who successfully access nursery education, and to develop the home learning environment for the children who are supported through the project.

Places are targeted at children who are the most economically disadvantaged in the district and who are also facing other difficulties including issues such as domestic violence, substance misuse, who are disabled or who have several siblings also aged under 5.

249 Children were accessing a funded place through the Two Year Old Offer at the beginning of the Spring Term of 2010. Bradford has been allocated 350 places 2010-11. In addition to the national pilot, we have also acted locally to commission two year old places in eight voluntary pre-school playgroups in the 10% most disadvantaged communities.

Our approach to working with parents of very young children to support their children's learning is extending the work undertaken during the Parents as Partners in Early Learning Project (PPEL) by again following the approach developed by the Pen Green Research and Development Centre in their training package PICL (Parents Involved in their Children's Learning). A licensing agreement has resulted in one course for group-setting practitioners and another for registered childminders being delivered to excellent evaluation during the Spring Term. We have encouraged additional authority officers to undertake the training with a view to becoming co-trainers, and one officer is planning to undertake her Masters module to enable her to become a Pen Green licensed trainer in Bradford.

Demand for places on PICL was such that an additional three courses for group setting practitioners and two for registered childminders have been run by trainers from Pen Green Research and Development Centres. As a result of this activity, we have trained 98 practitioners, in addition to the 79 practitioners who accessed PICL training under the Parents as Partners in Early Learning (PPEL) Project.

3.4 Disabled Children's Access to Childcare (DCATCH)

Bradford is one of ten local authorities piloting the Disabled Children's Access to Childcare (DCATCH) project which runs from October 2008 until March 2011. The Department for Children Schools and Families (DCSF) funds the project which is a strand of the Aiming High for Disabled Children programme. A recurrent message from parents of disabled children in Bradford was that accessing childcare for their disabled child became increasingly difficult as their child got older; this was illustrated in quantitative research with 170 parents through the Disabled Children's Information Service newsletter, and qualitative research with 112 parents conducted at the start of the DCATCH project. Therefore, the DCATCH project in Bradford has a specific focus on improving registered childcare provision for children aged 5 and over. The project has three key outcomes:

- Instil confidence in parents to use childcare services and improve opportunities for parents children and young people to be involved in the design and delivery of services.
- Build the confidence of staff and childcare settings in meeting the needs of disabled children and young people.

- Increase the use of childcare by disabled children and young people through extended childcare choices.

Sustainability is integral to the project. By building the capacity of universal childcare providers to include disabled children DCATCH aims to ensure that take up of childcare by disabled children continues to increase beyond the end of the project. To achieve these outcomes, the project funds four Inclusion Officers who will be providing a support and challenge role with all 80 out of school and holiday childcare providers in the district. An Inclusion Quality Standard (IQS) for post five settings has also been developed and 15 settings on this kite mark award in 2009/2010. There is an aim for an additional 19 settings to work towards this kite mark in 2010/2011. DCATCH also funds ten play support workers who support disabled children to access childcare through the play partner model. In 2009/2010, 74 individual children were supported into childcare through this work.

3.6 Take-up of Childcare among Black and Minority Ethnic Families April 2009-March 2010

This project aimed to increase take-up of formal childcare among Black and Minority Ethnic families in the Barkerend, Princeville and Crossley Hall areas of Bradford:

- Barkerend outreach workers have supported 48 children to access early education between October 2009 and March 2010. The project also provided valuable insight into some of the reasons for low take-up. Some parents were still not aware of the free entitlement (22%), but there were also significant barriers for parents who were aware of their children's entitlement to free early education, notably a lack of confidence to approach provision (30%) and confusion about waiting lists or difficulty getting/understanding information from schools about application processes (20%).
- In Princeville a new pre-school playgroup is due to open in April 2010. The voluntary management committee is made up of local parents who are training to NVQ2 in childcare and have undertaken parenting training.
- Crossley Hall Out-of-School Club opened in September 2009. 25 children accessed month-long free taster sessions between January and March; there are now a number of children regularly accessing the club as paying customers.

3.7 Supported day care

A small number of childcare places are being funded in Children Centres to enable families to access family support work. This programme is being expanded to cover up to 15 children's centres in 2010-11.

3.8 Phase 3 Children Centres

Phase 3 centres will provide improved access to services for families living outside the most disadvantaged areas. Services will include: outreach services for isolated families at greatest risk of social exclusion; information and advice for mothers, fathers and carers on a range of subjects for young children including childcare; support for childminders via a quality-assured, co-ordinated network; activities for parents/carers and children at the centre; and links to Jobcentre Plus advice on training and employment opportunities.

In Bradford eight new Children Centres are being developed to serve the communities of: Bingley and Bingley Rural, Baildon, Menston & Burley-in-Wharfedale, Silsden & Steeton, Ilkley & Addingham, Haworth and Frizinghall. No additional childcare facilities are being developed in the Phase 3 children centres.

4. Developments since last assessment

4.1 Assessment of Parental Demand for Childcare

Since April 2009, 27 childcare demand feasibilities have been carried out in conjunction with individuals and organisation wishing to assess the need to develop new childcare services. Of these:

- 3 feasibility studies have indicated sufficient demand to develop childcare. All have been supported to open childcare in 2009-10.
- 2 feasibility studies indicated insufficient demand at this time
- 9 feasibility studies indicated sufficient demand and are a priority action for place creation in 2009-2010

Between January 1st and 31st December 2009 Bradford Children's Information Link sent out 4,245 childcare reports to parents wishing to understand their childcare options. This represents a decrease on the previous year, although hits on the website have increased significantly over the year.

4.2 Sustainability Support

Sustainability support is available to childcare settings experiencing short-term cashflow difficulties. Requests for group based sustainability support have remained surprisingly static despite the combined factors of the recession and the increased promotion of the fund to all group settings. Total expenditure on Sustainability Support in 2009/10 (grants only, excluding officer time) amounted to £117k across 6 settings plus an additional £20k issued in one-off Marketing Grants to 40 settings. This figure compares favourably in terms of maximizing help to settings with £62k across 4 settings in 2008/09. In addition, this year a number of settings were helped to achieve sustainability without financial support.

22 childminders accessed sustainability support via a childminding co-ordinator in 2009-10. This is the same as 2008-9 level, and seems to point to a level of stability in demand in spite of the recession.

4.3 Improving Quality (EYQUISP)

Bradford has adopted National Strategies' Early Years Quality Improvement Support Programme (EYQUISP). This is a nationally recognised programme which provides guidance and tools for local authority staff and leaders of early years settings to support continuous quality improvement in line with the principles of the Early Years Foundation Stage framework and Every Child Matters.

The programme uses self-evaluation and categorisation tools to provide a mechanism for childcare providers and the local authority to discuss and agree the type and level of support needed, ensuring that the local authority's resources are targeted where they are most needed. Bradford has been piloting the approach in 2009-10 and will roll out the programme to all settings on the Early Years Register in 2010-11.

4.4 Affordability of Childcare

Widespread promotion of the childcare element of Working Tax Credit has been undertaken in 2009-10. The promotional campaign comprised advertising accompanying Council Tax bills to all households in the BMDC area, A1 posters displayed in the districts three market halls, promotional leaflets supplied to 50 GP Surgeries across the district, links with Parental Involvement Workers in schools and health visiting teams established, along with provision of banners and leaflets for parents' events, provision of leaflets to childcare settings, benefits offices, local authority customer service centres, Job Centre Plus links including presence at local Mosque Schools and further/higher education establishments, Children's Information Link and all of the district's libraries.

Working Tax Credit training has been delivered to more than 100 partners from children's centres, schools, voluntary umbrella groups, customer service representatives, NHS childcare team, debt advisors and Job Centre Plus staff in the target areas showed a significant uplift in confidence to give advice on WTC. Very positive feedback was recorded from delegates attending the training.

Quarterly Snapshot for 2009 of the number of families benefiting from childcare element of Working Tax Credit as a percentage of the number of families receiving more than the family element of Child Tax Credit

- April 15.61%
- July 15.64%
- Sept 16.40%
- Dec 16.67%

4.5 Work with Bradford Employers

Work with Bradford's employers promoting the importance of childcare to their businesses and employees is due to re-commence in April 2010. Contact will be made with Companies in the Top 50 employers who have previously completed a childcare questionnaire in 2007. This questionnaire is to be re-run to enable evaluation of any changes which have occurred in the intervening period on topics such as their adoption of flexible working, Childcare Voucher schemes etc. A survey will then be extended to Companies across the Bradford district employing over 100 staff. This will be undertaken by a combination of

'phone and mail. In conjunction with this an employee survey will be conducted to establish use of and attitudes to childcare and again compare results to the employee survey undertaken in 2007.
