

## How to read the Schedule of Proposed Changes

This schedule documents each change from the first deposit Plan which has been made to form the revised deposit Plan. The production of such a schedule is a requirement of the Town and Country Planning Act (Development Plan)(England) Regulations 1999.

The schedule is arranged in the order of the documents which form the Plan. Commencing with the Policy Framework and then the Proposals Report for each Parliamentary Constituency sorted by alphabetical order (i.e. Bradford North first and Shipley last)

The schedule has three columns:

- The first column shows the part of the plan which has been revised e.g. policy or paragraph. New policies have a suffix A e.g. TM10A. Additional paragraphs are numbered using the immediately preceding paragraph number and a suffix a, b etc depending on how many additional paragraphs are inserted at that point. Additional sites are numbered consecutively following from the last number used in the first deposit Proposals Reports. Where sites or policies are deleted the number is not reused.
- The second column identifies the reasons for the change and gives a brief indication of what has changed
- The third Column identifies what has generated the change and the categories which have a numeric code as follows:
  1. Arising from an objection
  2. Arising from changes in national or regional policy
  3. Arising from local changes in policy
  4. A factual change
  5. Arising from drafting error
  6. Change of circumstances e.g. the grant of planning permission
