Childcare Sufficiency Review 2009

1. Overview

This report summarises key influences on the market for childcare in Bradford in 2008-9

- **Assesses key supply and demand factors**
- **Gives details of current relevant local and national childcare initiatives**
- **Details progress against the District's childcare action plan in 2008-9**
- **Provides updated childcare market statistics**

Statistical information has been provided on two bases:

(i) On the same basis as the 2008-11 assessment using 14 sub-local authority area profiles and 2007-8 Ofsted childcare definitions to enable year-on-year comparisons

(ii) On the basis of new Ofsted childcare definitions analysed by Ward. This is the format which is proposed for future childcare sufficiency assessments.

It should be noted that the changes in Ofsted categorisation of childcare have made some year-on-year comparisons difficult

2. The Market for Childcare in Bradford 2008-9

2.1 Childcare for Children Aged 0 to 4

The number of day care providers in the district increased by 4%, to 108, while the number of childminders fell by 4%, to 527. The net effect of these changes has been a marginal increase in the total stock of childcare places, and a slight redistribution of the stock of places away from home-based provision towards group provision, which now accounts for 78% of the district's pre-five provision.

The total number of children aged 0 to 4 also rose by 4% over the year to 38,530. This means that the number of childcare places per 100 children has declined from 17.1 in 2008 to 16.3 in 2009. Despite the rise in the number of children relative to places, occupancy of places has fallen to 69% , down from 73% as the recession takes hold. Occupancy of home-based childcare is holding slightly firmer at 77%.

The costs of childcare have increased by an average of 7% in the year to February 2009. The average cost of daycare is now £145.00 per week, although there are significant local variations and costs vary from a minimum of £110 to a maximum of £220 a week. Childminding costs have risen to an average of £3.28 per hour, again there are significant variations, with hourly rates ranging between £2 and £6 across the district.

Childcare for children aged 5+

The number of schools with no linked childcare has reduced from 50 (23% of all schools) to 38 (17% of all schools) and this is an increase of 8%. The greatest growth has been among informal breakfast and homework clubs which have grown from 72 to 94 clubs. There remains a lack of provision linked to secondary schools.

Occupancy of formal out-of-school childcare places has fallen from 66% to 64%. The impact of recession has both reduced demand and increased options for informal childcare.

3. Local and National Influences on the Sufficiency of Childcare in Bradford

3.1 Childcare Act 2008

The introduction of the Childcare Act has resulted in a number of regulatory changes for childcare providers. This in turn has had a significant impact on the data used to assess sufficiency. Providers caring for children up to the term after their 5th birthday must now register on the Early Years Register. Early Years providers are inspected on a 3 year cycle against the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

Providers caring for children from 5- 7 years must register on the Ofsted Childcare Register and providers caring for over 8's can register on the Voluntary Childcare Register. Later years providers are not routinely inspected however 10% of these providers in England will receive an inspection.

Schools are not required to be on the Early Years Register unless they care for under 3's. Childcare provision for under 5's in schools will be inspected against the Early Years Foundation Stage as part of their school inspection. Crèche provision is exempt from compulsory registration.

3.2 Disabled Children's Access To Childcare (DCATCH)

Bradford has been chosen as one of ten local authorities to take part in the first wave of a pilot scheme which aims to increase disabled children's access to childcare. Department for Children Schools and Families (DCSF) funding for the project runs from 2008-2011. Over the past 18 months Bradford Early Years Childcare and Play (BEYCP) have contacted parents of disabled children using different methods to find out how to improve childcare services and to make sure that they are able to access the type that suits them most. The DCATCH pilot offers a real opportunity to build on existing good practice and ensure there is sufficient, good quality, inclusive childcare provision across the Bradford District. The project focuses on childcare for children age 5 and over.

3.3 Funded 2 years old places

Bradford has been a pilot authority for early education for 2-year-olds since 2006. The pilot has now been extended to March 2011 with 60 Local Authorities taking part to deliver 20,000 free childcare places in the most disadvantaged communities. Bradford has been allocated: 150 places 2008-9, 250 places 2009-10, 350 places 2010-11. In addition to the national pilot, we have also acted locally to commission two year old places in eight voluntary pre-school playgroups in the 10% most disadvantaged communities.

3.4 Take up of Childcare among Black and Minority Ethnic Families April 2009-March 2010

Another DCSF pilot, this project aims at increasing take up of formal childcare among Black and Minority Ethnic families. In Bradford the project is targeting three areas with differing levels of childcare market maturity. In Barkerend where there is low take-up of 3-4 yr old early education and empty places in existing provision, work is being undertaken to recruit an Early Learning Outreach Worker to support hard to reach families not taking up early years provision. In Princeville where there is low take-up of 3-4 early education places and a lack of available places development of a new parent-managed pre-school playgroup is under way. At Crossley Hall Primary School new out-of-school childcare is being developed. Taster sessions will be available for families considering taking up work or training.

3.5 Extension to Early Education Entitlement for Three and Four Year Olds

From September 2010 three and four year old children will be entitled to 15 hours a week free early education. The increased entitlement should be delivered flexibly, where practicable, to meet family needs. The extended offer should be made available to the 25% most disadvantaged children from September 2009. A maximum of 6 hours of early education will be funded in any one day. Early education must be provided over a minimum of 38 weeks and funding can be shared between a maximum of two different providers. The universal free entitlement can be offered over more than 38 weeks in a year, but is subject to a maximum of 570 hours in a year. Providers involved in the early roll out have been identified; the 25% most disadvantaged children in the district are concentrated most intensely around just 40 settings, most of which are primary school nursery classes.

3.6 Supported day care

A small number of childcare places are being funded in ten Phase 1 and 2 Children Centres to enable families to access family support work.

3.7 Early Years Capital Funding

Bradford District has been allocated £7.7m of capital funding by the Department for Children Schools and Families for the period 2008-11. The DCSF requires that the capital grant is spent on the following priorities for young children:

- Improving the quality of the learning environment in early years settings to support delivery of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS:early education and care for children up to age five), with a particular emphasis on improving play and physical activities; and ICT resources
- Ensuring all children, including disabled children, are able to access provision, in line with local childcare sufficiency assessments
- Enabling providers to deliver the extension to the free early education offer for 3 and 4 year olds and to do so flexibly

An assessment of need has been undertaken with all existing providers delivering EYFS and grant applications will be complete within the next 18 months. Provision has been made to support capital requirements for identified gaps in the childcare market.

3.8 Phase 3 Children Centres

Phase 3 centres will provide improved access to services for families living outside the most disadvantaged areas. Services will include: outreach services for isolated families at greatest risk of social exclusion; information and advice for mothers, fathers and carers on a range of subjects for young children including childcare; support for childminders via a quality-assured, co-ordinated network; activities for parents/carers and children at the centre; and links to Jobcentre Plus advice on training and employment opportunities. In Bradford seven new Children Centres have been proposed to serve the communities of: Bingley (2 centres), Baildon, Worth, Craven and Ilkley/Wharfedale (2 centres). No additional childcare is being developed in the Phase 3 children centres.

4. Developments since last assessment

4.1 Assessment of Parental Demand for Childcare

Since April 2008 17 childcare demand feasibilities have been carried out in conjunction with individuals and organisation wishing to assess the need to develop new childcare services.

- 5 feasibility studies have indicated sufficient demand to develop childcare. All have been supported to open childcare in 2008-9.
- 4 feasibility studies indicated insufficient demand at this time
- 8 feasibility studies indicated sufficient demand and are a priority action for place creation in 2009-2010

Between January 2008 and 31st December 08 the Children's Information Link sent out 7284 childcare reports to parents wishing to understand their childcare options. This represents a 10% increase on the previous year.

As part of the Disabled Children's Access To Childcare (DCATCH) project 112 parents been consulted through events and attendance at support groups. Partnership working with Barnardo's has enabled qualitative research to take place to identify childcare and short break needs.

4.2 Sustainability Support

Requests for group based sustainability support have increased slightly in the last couple of months but this has tended to be work with settings who have regularly had issues and have been in receipt of funding previously. It is anticipated that more requests for support will occur in 2009-10 as those settings which have always had the capability to plan ahead and have had reserves or a contingency budget to fall back on begin to feel the economic downturn. Requests may then come from sources who have never previously approached EYCP for support and it will be necessary to promote the BEYP Sustainability Support Strategy more widely with simpler criteria in order to make it more accessible to all settings.

22 childminders accessed sustainability support via a childminding co-ordinator in 08-09. Childminding Co-ordinators are reporting that many childminders have vacant places due to the economic downturn and are feeling anxious about the next few months.

4.3 Improving quality and raising standards

The Local Authority has an Early Years Outcomes Duty Plan which sets out plans to raise educational achievement of all children and young people, and **Narrow the Gap** in educational achievement between children from low income and disadvantaged backgrounds and their peers. This plan includes the different programmes and strategies funded by DCSF to help improve outcomes and raise quality:

- **ECAT** (Every Child a Talker) being delivered to 20 settings
- **CLLD** (Communication, Language and Literacy) programme for targeted schools to raise the standards in this area of the curriculum.
- **MABD** (Making a Big Difference) programme which is engaging 11 schools with a focus on Boys' Achievement and English as an additional language.
- **MABD-Buddying** programme which has 3 strands – Outdoor play, Transition and Data collection. These 3 strands are to develop links between practitioner in private, voluntary and independent sector settings and school practitioners in order to share expertise and knowledge with respect to practice.
- **QUISP** (Quality Improvement Support Programme) this programme will help all settings to review and reflect on their quality and practice and plan for development through a categorisation process involving the setting and the Early Years Childcare Play and Parental Involvement Team in each locality.
- **SEAD** (Social and Emotional Aspects of Development) is a new training programme which will be rolled out in Autumn 09

4.4 Affordability of the childcare market

Since the last assessment BEYCP have been promoting Working Tax Credits via newly designed leaflets for providers and parents. We have also commissioned a series of tailored, interactive training seminars, aimed at putting the sources of financial support for childcare into context and up-skilling staff in how to advise parents and use the HMRC calculator.

5. Childcare Sufficiency Review 2009

The number of day nurseries in the district increased by 4%, to 108, this is largely due to the development of childcare places in Phase 2 Children Centres. The number of childminders fell by 4%, to 527. Although there was an increase in the number of childminders registered in 2008-9, more have closed compared to the previous year. The introduction of the EYFS and the new Ofsted regulations may have affected closures. The apparent reduction in the numbers of both crèche and sessional providers (playgroups) is largely due to Ofsted re-categorisation. The new Ofsted definitions will be used henceforward for future Childcare sufficiency Assessments.

The total number of children aged 0 to 4 across the district rose by 4.4% over the year to 38,530 however the 2007 child health data may have under reported children birth to one year. There have been significant increases in BD4, BD7, North Bradford, Shipley and West Bradford and a significant decrease in Craven, Ilkley and Wharfedale. Priority actions will be undertaken to assess the impact of these changes at ward level.

Some of the apparent reductions in day nursery places are due to removal of places for children aged 5+ from the data. In Bradford West the apparent increase in places is largely due to a change in registration of nursery school provision. Two daycare settings closed in Manningham.

The data suggest the number of sessional (playgroup) places in the district decreased significantly in 2008-9. There has not, however, been a reduction in the actual number of sessional places but there has been a change in how childcare is registered (previously one provider could hold more than one type of registration).

The data indicate that the number of crèche places decreased. The nature of crèche provision is fluid, however, and some of this decrease will be down to multiple registrations, now incorporated into a single childcare registration following the changes in Ofsted registration.

There are 4,898 0-4 group based full day care places which is an increase of 116 places since the 2008 assessment and 1,383 0-4 childminding places which is a decrease of 64 places. The data show that the proportionate split of childminding places available for under 1's and 1-4's has remained the same. However in group based day care the proportion of places for 3 and 4 year olds has grown to 73% of the overall places.

The number of schools with no linked childcare has reduced from 50 (23% of all schools) to 38 (17% of all schools). OFSTED-registered and school-run provision increased 8% from 105 to 113 settings, following parental feasibility and childcare place creation, but the greatest growth has been among informal breakfast and homework clubs, which have grown from 72 to 94 clubs. Childminders linked to schools remains static.
