**Title:** Supporting People Lead Officer Update  
**Date:** 17 September 2009

**1. Training on the new QAF MANDATORY from February 2010**

New QAF training will take place on 20 October 2009. This will be split into 2 sessions with additional information from Equality Works on fair access, diversity and inclusion to highlight the key issues relating to equality impact assessments. Venue to be confirmed. **So Player asked about priority places for women's services due to timing of review – Jayne confirmed that enough spaces would be available for all providers.**

**If you have any other training issues as a group or as individuals please let the SP team know.**

**2. Contract reviews coming up**

**Mental health** – annual reviews – paperwork to be sent out 5 October 2009

**Domestic Violence** – sector reviews – paperwork to be sent out 5 October 2009 noting an overall 4 week extension to the review due to Christmas.

**Learning disabilities** – review on hold due to integration of review with the Changing Lives programme.

**3. Staff update**

- Susan Moreland in post as the Changing Lives service user involvement officer (hosted by SP).
- Alex Mullett started on 7 September as a Transition Officer
- Tyler Moore starts on 21 September as the Transition Manager
- Carol Bibby starts on 28 September 2009 as a Transition Officer

Full team contact details with email and telephone numbers will be posted on the website.

**4. Unallocated funds**

The Commissioning Body will be asked at their meeting on 21 September to approve the recommendation of the Strategic Core Group to open up another round of bids for the use of unallocated funds. A bidding pro-forma will be developed in the next few weeks and sent to providers. Approval is being sought with some conditions attached which include:

- Funds will not be used to increase capacity in services.
- Consideration will be taken on providers failing to reach level B of the existing QAF. This means that those providers having recently undergone a review and not reaching level B **may not** be considered. Some discretion will be applied to those nearly achieving level B as funding may help with the process.
- The strongest bids will relate to achieving outcomes through the support planning process and so providers should consider the 5 CLG outcomes and how service users are being supported to achieve their goals.

- Funds will be allocated through monthly payments or a one off payment post delivery. In other words no funding up front.

Last years unallocated spend will be analysed over the next few weeks and this will tell us which schemes have achieved their outcomes. There is more time this year to consider the process and so it will be tightened up in relation to spend and outcomes. Tyler Moore will assist Jayne in leading on the process.

If any providers have ideas about the use of the unallocated grant in relation to the principles of spend please let Jayne know before 2 October 2009.

**5. Regional update** *If you wish to feedback on the development of this strategy please contact Jayne Hellowell or Sheila Bamford directly*

Regional Strategy brief has been developed. This will go out to consultation with a deadline of 16 October 2009. The main aim of the strategy is to:

**a. The driving forces in housing related support**

Reference will be made to:

- Personalisation
- Community Strategies referencing SP to LSP structures
- The efficiency agenda
- Public health and reduced crime levels
- Learning and Skills and the Worklessness agenda
- Client involvement in service delivery
- Regional and Partnership working

**b. The outcomes of housing related support**

Reference will be made to:

- National Indicators 141 and 142
- Reference to LAA NI's and the relationship to NI 141 and NI142
- CLG outcomes data

The chapter will show how housing related support delivers other local priorities in accordance with LAA targets.

**c. The value of housing related support: Cost realisation**

The Cap Gemini Cost Modelling Toolkit published by CLG will be used to evidence the financial gains of housing related support. Individual authorities will be requested to supply local data which will be quality checked as far as possible.

**d. The Supporting People programme – good practice**

This chapter will highlight good practice and the effectiveness of the Supporting People programme in delivering quality services.

Reference will be made to:

- Use of the Quality Assessment Framework to assess the quality of service delivery
- Partnership working across health, probation and local authority housing and social care in commissioning services
- Flexibility and innovation – examples will show the ability to respond to whole person needs by commissioning innovative and joined up services
- Service User involvement – the increasing contribution of service users in the delivery of the programme

**e. The future of housing related support**

This chapter will highlight the contribution of partners and stakeholders in the future delivery of housing related support, including local authorities, housing, social services, providers, private landlords and voluntary action groups as well as service users. It will be an appeal to a wide cross section of people to own the housing related support agenda as making an important contribution to the wellbeing of society and to a well thought out integrated regional strategy.

## 6. Total Places

Total Place looks at how a 'whole area' approach to public services in a local area can lead to better services at less cost through 13 pilot areas in England. Bradford has been chosen to be one of these pilot areas. Our Total Place project will ask fundamental questions about how public spending in Bradford fits with the priorities of the Bradford District Partnership, and how services can be improved to drive improved outcomes and greater efficiency.

Bradford District Partnership owns the Total Place Project and has worked together to identify an overall theme of providing a 'gateway to integrated services' and has agreed to develop the methodology by focusing on three key themes:

- Children leaving a care environment
- Older people leaving hospital/care environments
- Offenders leaving prison

It is our intention for each of the sub theme leaders to engage service providers/commissioners, service users and other key stakeholders throughout the process to develop an understanding of:

- What we do now and how well it works?
- What is the service users' experience of what we do now?
- What do we do well that we should be sharing?
- What are the barriers and issues that prevent us doing well in some areas?
- How can we remove those barriers and issues and deliver a much more effective and efficient service to the users?
- How can we make the most of the total public sector spend in these areas?

A number of commissioning intentions have been identified through the Supporting People 5 year strategy and through the outcome of sector reviews. Some new commissions are to be put on hold until the outcome of the Total Place is known for each client group as Supporting People may well be invited to jointly commission as a result of this strategic work.

John Hill noted that "Systems Change" pilot running at the same time as this – need to ensure both tie in together. John Hill to ensure Neil Maloney is aware of this

Neal Heard asked if three client groups to be used to highlight wider issues too? Jayne suggested that much would come out of this about transitional period good practice which can then be applied across the board. GS noted key point from total places day was about the continuity of keyworker along a clients journey – discussed an example of early release programme.

SP Gateway – Pam Bennett queried development on this Common Access pathway. Jayne noted the ongoing debate with procurement department about this. Jayne advised providers not to wait for SP on this but to progress as they would usually.

Personalisation Agenda – Bradford's position was queried. Jayne noted that Liz Delaney was in post as manager and working with Inpower examining Resource Allocation Systems and other issues. SP team is fully involved in this process from the beginning and Jayne stressed that this is not just about individuals.

Mike Harney – CLG Outcomes and evidence – Bradford funding according to a different set of priorities from the LAA. How are SP funded groups ensuring they are seen by LSP. The close partnership with Roz hall was noted and CLG Outcomes and indicators are examined at this level. CLG outcomes forms must be completed by providers as these will be monitored, analysed etc. In principle LAA see CLG information as good data but are still working to marry up indicators N141 and 142 in this whole band of indicators.

## **Lorraine Reagan – Guest Speaker – handouts distributed**

What are Bradford LAA priority indicators and targets?

Audit Commission report 2005-2009 – what Supporting People has achieved – this is being published next week and will be available on the SPKWeb.

John Hill queried steer from central government and LSPB's – SITRA evaluation of third sector/ CVS on LSPBs – on behalf of CLG with a view to developing guidance for local authorities in future.

Change of government may impact on indicators in future – noted timescale of any changes in line with final spending review. Likely those indicators will change irrespective of government. Chief Executive of Bradford is to strategically plan in advance of government change – Price Waterhouse Cooper are involved in this review of Bradford already so authority is prepared for changes.

## **5 Elections**

Graham Mynott was thanked for his input to the Core Group in previous years.

## **6 Core Group Feedback**

Jenny Moran-Whitehead informed the group of work with Neal Heard and Katie Nutman to try and map the involvement of carers. Would like to try and develop case studies from this wider forum to engage a wider spectrum of carers.

Carers fall between service users and professional providers so it is how to effectively engage and consider role of this group in future. Need to be sensitive to this area in terms of expectations, confidentiality family dynamics etc.

Feedback to date is for this group to link and ask specific questions of carers groups rather than engage on this forum initially. Could be involved in service user involvement process perhaps to start with until this can be assessed further.

John Hill asked if there is any attempt to define what is meant by carer. Could be any family member or friend involved in support. Does carer imply a professional role – do we need to think of family/persona involved in a client's case? Is there a need to define this?

Discussed significant role of family members in some cases but carer as a traditional term has different connotations.

Jenny agreed to circulate questionnaire for information to all providers.

The question is what does this forum and Supporting People want to see from involvement in these groups? Jayne Hellowell and Jenny agreed to consider any future dialogue with these groups.

## **7 Regional Provider Forum Feedback**

Minutes are on the SP website but there has been no further meeting to report on recently.

Key research was noted.

National Housing Federation Chief Executive has been asked to take on board this agenda as key role during the year.

## **8 Fixed Capacity Contracts – long term services only**

Jayne Hellowell has sought approval to agree fixed price on long term services to replace the current bureaucratic system of monthly form submission by providers and knowledge of amount to be received every month. If this is agreed then the next stage will be to agree a fixed price for services with providers based on the returns made in past three years.

Fixed price will be subject to audit and some risk management processes.

Individual provider discussions will take place where services have not yet operated for three years.

## **9 Paying for Hours, not Units**

Jayne Hellowell noted future consideration of paying for a number of clients x number of hours per client. Works best in person-centred floating support planning.

John Hill noted flexibility for providers but also a need to address unintended consequences on KPI's and outcomes which could be confusing and difficult bureaucracy. Jayne Hellowell felt that there were learning opportunities with this approach before deciding whether or not it would work or not. GS felt this would make a real difference to services users. Paul Gartland felt there was enough flexibility in current provision in floating support services and issue arising from a move to hours could be difficult to manage for support workers. Anchor staff suggested those would cause a lot of difficulties due to nature of low-level long-term support. Would changes be across the board or different for long and short term?

Jayne Hellowell noted that the whole point is to work with providers through review periods to ensure right support package and right safe environment in place for service users. Paul Gartland asked if providers could make approach to Supporting People is such a contract might work best for them? Jayne felt that

some of this would be considered by Gary Furze – not a priority but will be picked up in future.

BDCT (Jenny) – noted request from BDCT to enable some flexibility and pathway/outcome measurement.

### **10 Tenancy Ready Scheme**

MA noted work with John Sloane, Neal Heard and Katie Nutman plus a group of ten to develop a pack for all providers to use as generic tenancy ready scheme for all groups to work from point of contact through to maintaining own tenancy. A draft copy has been completed on PowerPoint; leaflets and posters are now being prepared. This is user-friendly for clients and easy to understand for providers. This is to be delivered by client to clients.

This will be used to show service users what other people have thought and to assist frontline staff in knowing how service users might think in order to help develop links and support.

Originally three models of this were being considered but there is now recognition that many providers have examples of their own work which maybe used. Core modules will be embraced in Bradford which people should do – there is now a “Quality Audit Panel” to spot check services to ensure these are operating effectively.

Mike Harney – led on the “Stepping Forward” tenancy ready scheme so keen to make links with other models and people on working group – marry this up to core group objectives.

Once the presentation is ready it will go to service user involvement group (8.10.09) then will be shown at Provider Forum and other groups.
