Supported Housing



What is Supported Housing?

Supported housing gives disabled people a chance to live independently. This is living in a home on their own. They will have care and support available at all times, every day of the week.



What is Westwood Park?

Westwood Park Supported Housing Scheme is a partnership.

Bradford Social Services and Habinteg Housing Association Ltd worked together with disabled people to design it.



Westwood Park allows 50 disabled people to live there in their own home. The people staying can have a say in the way things work there.



There is a manager who works there 5 days a week.

There is also a community support team. They are there to support and help the people staying there at all times.

What facilities are there at Westwood Park?



There are 44 accessible housing places.

These include:

- An extra care block with shared areas and 20 one bedroom flats
- 15 two bedroom bungalows
- A bungalow style block with 5 one bedroom flats



- A bungalow block with 4 one bedroom flats and staff rooms
- A respite care unit with 3 one bedroom flats and a staff flat
- 6 two bedroom sheltered bungalows for people over 60 years of age.



The scheme has easy wheelchair access, with extra wide corridors. All flats have an alarm call system, some with remote control entry.



All flats are designed to easily have hoists put in to help with moving. They have enough space so that special equipment can be added if needed.

There are lots of communal facilities, these are areas that everyone can use.



Communal Facilities included are:

- communal lounges
- restaurant providing freshly cooked meals daily
- assisted bathrooms
- shop
- therapy room



- staff offices, restroom and sleepover accommodation
- laundry
- mobility room for recharging of wheelchairs
- dog exercise area in grounds
