

# Wilsden Neighbourhood Development Plan Information Statement

A Referendum relating to the Wilsden Neighbourhood Development Plan will be held on **Thursday, 27 March 2025**. This statement provides information on the Referendum that is taking place, and the Neighbourhood Development Plan it relates to.

#### The Referendum Question

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is "**Do you want City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Wilsden to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?**"

#### The Neighbourhood Area

The Referendum area is identified on the map which is included with this information statement. The Referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Wilsden Neighbourhood Development Plan Area.

#### Who Can Vote

A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if:

- They are entitled to vote in an election of any Councillor of City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council whose area is in the Referendum area; and
- Their qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

If more than 50% of individuals vote "yes" in the Referendum, then City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council will formally "make" the Wilsden Neighbourhood Development Plan. If the Neighbourhood Plan is "made" it will form part of the Statutory Development Plan for Bradford District and help to determine planning applications with the Neighbourhood Plan Area. If more people vote "no" than "yes" then the Neighbourhood Plan will not be "made" and will not be part of the statutory Development Plan for Bradford District.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.

Legislation requires electors to show an accepted form of photographic identification at the polling station when voting in person. Further details of accepted forms of identification can be found by visiting: <u>https://www.bradford.gov.uk/your-council/elections-and-voting/voter-id/</u>

### **Referendum Expenses**

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2,581.13

The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 3,714.
