Notes:  
The photomontages produced are for the temporary, worst-case scenario. The viewpoints for which photomontages have been generated are the ones where The Site is considered to be the most prominent. The 'worst case scenario' is the point during the lifetime of The Site when any landscape impact(s) would be greatest, due to the largest areas of stripped ground or most visible faces. These worst case scenarios are temporary and would quickly evolve as working and restoration progresses.

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Looking north towards The Site during all phases of operation. The 10m standoff between the southern extraction boundary and the southern boundary of The Site along with the dry-stone wall on the southern boundary of The Site would screen the operations from this viewpoint. The Working Phasing Plan (ref: 232/5 - 3) and the Restoration Phasing Plan (ref: 232/5 - 10) are included in this application.

**232/5-12b: Photomontage of Viewpoint 14**



Looking west-northwest towards The Site during the working of Phase 6. The restoration of Phases A and B has been completed to the point where the restoration contours have been achieved and vegetation planting has been started. The eastern face is now at its final retained height of approximately 5m and would be visible from this viewpoint. The dry-stone walls along the top of the eastern and northern faces would be visible from this viewpoint. The Working Phasing Plan (ref: 232/5 - 3) and the Restoration Phasing Plan (ref: 232/5 - 10) are included in this application.

It is estimated that this would be the view from this location for approximately 1 to 2 months as extraction would immediately start after Phase 6 has been stripped, revealing more of the already restored Phases.
