This representation argues that the City of Bradford Metropolitan District Council Plan is unsound particularly as it relates to the release of greenbelt in Wharfedale for the provision of up to 800 new houses. The Plan is not positively prepared or justified, nor does it meet local infrastructure requirements. Wharfedale does not require 800 new houses to meet local employment requirements. These homes will simply be occupied by commuters requiring additional transport infrastructure to jobs in the conurbations of Leeds and Bradford. The increased population will add further pressure on local resources and require additional supporting services to be provided by Bradford Council. Additional Council Tax revenue generated as a result of these new houses is will not benefit the Wharfedale community when prioritized against the region's requirements as a whole with a projected mean cut in spending of £115m over the next three years on top of the cuts of £100m already made (Clr Green). The plan is not justified. It would make far more sense to protect green belt revitalizing more empty homes (CIr Green) and make far better use of available brownfield sites. The Plan is not sustainable in relation to the destruction of Wharfedale greenfield sites. Of particular concern is the destruction of sites IL/02, IL/019, IL/014 and IL/009. While building on IL/019 and IL/009 will produce eyesores at high elevations on both sides of the valley, impinging on ancient woodland and bluebell woods, building on sites IL/014 and IL/012 will result in virtual ribbon development all the way from Guiseley almost to the outskirts of Addingham. This creeping urbanisation is a major threat to the Wharfefdale environment and will damage the very qualities that draw visitors and prosperity to the locality. Lack of sustainability is obvious within the plan. Once greenfield sites are destroyed, they are gone forever, yet the Plan is disingenuous in its promises to compensate by improvements to local infrastructure. Why does the Plan conflate release of green belt with improvements to local transport infrastructure (investment priority E) when these policies could be implemented independently? Also given the current economic climate and Bradford Council's
