The plan to create 200 new homes in Addingham to meet local needs has not been effectively assessed. The local need for Addingham is for a few affordable houses. The local need for the whole of Bradford Met. Is for affordable housing primarily in the City area where there are brown field sites which could be released, and also empty underused properties.

This beautiful rural setting has previously been protected by green belt legislation but the document proposes large green belt releases which may include sites in Addingham. This is probably the most environmentally sensitive area in the district. The council may not fully have taken into account the Habitats Regulations which restrict building in areas that are close to a Special Protection Area for birds such as Rombalds Moor and Beamsley Beacon.

There seem to be issues regarding sewage and drainage which have not been objectively assessed.

Areas in Main street and North Street are prone to flooding. More houses and access roads etc. mean less ground, for water absorption and therefore run off will increase causing more flooding.

Very little extra infra structure is currently included in the plan.

- 1. There are no specific plans for sites to expand or rebuild our local schools. I have been told that Addingham Primary School is only able to take 30 new pupils each year, which means that not all Addingham children are guaranteed a place, neither are they guaranteed a place in likley Grammar School. Addingham parents do not want to have to send their primary school aged children to likley or their older children to Keighley. Until this is sorted out few families will want to buy new houses in Addingham.
- 2. Most of these houses will be bought by commuters. There are no plans to increase car parking in

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Ilkley, or increase capacity on peak time trains which are already full.

3. There could be as many as 400 extra cars trying to get through the busy often congested Main Street, and up to 200 extra cars trying to negotiate Bolton Road to access the school if enough places are available This road is very narrow with bends and is very dangerous when the school day ends.

The analysis failed completely to recognise the patterns and densities of traffic movement through Addingham and along the A65 between the Wharfe valley and Yorkshire. At holiday times the traffic can back up from Ilkley as far as the Addingham bypass. Also Addingham is on the very busy route from the conurbations of Leeds and Bradford to the Yorkshire Dales.

The plan does not include windfall sites which have already been identified.

I am not against the building of new houses in Addingham but 200 are far too many. Most of the houses built will not solve Bradford's problems as many will not be affordable and will be too far away from families and work. I would suggest a number of affordable houses somewhere in the order of 50 to be built in small attractive plots in the character of the village.
