Additionally the core strategy should address the issue of none-adjoining conservation areas – the gaps between conservation areas which are becoming known as 'Conservation Fringe'. In order to protect conservation areas, it is necessary to enhance the areas around them, even though these have been previously excluded, usually due to their containing modern infill buildings of little architectural merit and the desire on the grounds of neatness to draw the lines tightly around specific conservation areas.

Conservation fringe has particular merit in built up areas where steep hillsides are a feature because of the impact of the townscape. Some distant buildings may have more impact than those that are close at hand but out of view. Protection for conservation fringe areas would also deter inappropriate developments on the edge but just outside conservation areas and foster uniformity with regard to street furniture, protection for trees, boundary treatments and street vistas.
