challenge the Plan on the grounds of legality for two reasons.

First representation

1. The consultation process was flawed at the last stage when the Core Strategy Further Engagement Draft was put out for consultation. At the same time, we were told, there was going to be a consultation on the Holme Wood and Tong Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and that the consultation on the Further Engagement Draft would run in parallel, but that was not what happened.
2. We didn't know whether our concerns about the NDP were being taken into account for the Core Development Framework Core Strategy Further Engagement Draft and vice versa.
3. As it happened the NDP process began and before it completed the Further Engagement Draft consultation started. The Further Consultation Draft put the urban extension at Holme Wood into a strategic context and contained much information about the wider area that wasn't available under the NDP Consultation.
4. The NDP Consultation then closed, and before the Council collated, analysed or even looked at the details of the consultation it voted on the NDP at Executive Meeting was held to approve the urban extension.
5. The Council was in disarray over the consultations because so many people complained that the Further Engagement Draft consultation had been scheduled over the Christmas and New Year Holidays to reduce peoples chance of registering concerns. The Council therefore extended the consultation on the Further Engagement Draft.
6. But it was too late, because by then it had already taken the decision on the urban extension and furthermore, in doing so the council were said they were discounting the views of anyone who was not a Bradford resident, and made it clear since that they were only really interested in the views of people living within the Holme Wood estate.
7. This made a mockery of the consultation and put people off putting in further comments on the Further Engagement Draft.
8. The case was clearly driving the horse in that the NDP was driving the Core Strategy rather than being informed by it.

Second representation

I think too much weight has been given by Bradford and by the consultees preparing reports to Bradford to the status of the NDC. I don't think that the NDC is really a neighbourhood development plan as the current legislation provides.

It has no real representation of any neighbourhood area, and indeed it doesn't seem to take any account of Tong Village where I live.

It is really only representative of the views of the Council and its Committees which manage most of the houses in the Holme Woods estate.

On what consultees say that the proposal to build houses in the Tong Valley has been "supported" by the Neighbourhood Development Plan, all they are saying is that the Council's proposals have been supported by the Council and its Committees.



The Plan fails on the grounds that the 'Duty to Co-operate' has not been observed. Also the Plan fails to show how Bradford considers that it has fulfilled this duty. There appears to be no documentation in Bradford's draft that identifies those with whom it has co-operated, how this has been done, and what has been achieved through the process.

I am concerned about the lack of cooperation in relation to the urban extension at Holme Wood:

The fact that Leeds lodges a formal objection to this shows that there has been no cooperation on this aspect of the Plan.

Not only has Bradford not consulted with Leeds and Kirklees at the preparation stage of the Plan, its Consultations have shown an appalling lack of consideration for the views or concerns of neighbouring authorities, particularly Leeds, as if there was conflict between them, rather than a common interest in making sure that developments on the edge of his authorities are planned and executed in such a way as to ensure that the interests of everyone at either side of the boundary are taken into account and that the developments are undertaken as part of a bigger and coherent strategy for the whole region.

There has been talk of a Leeds Bradford Corridor, but local authorities don't seem to agree on what that means. It seems to us that Tong and Holme Wood are not the focus of the Leeds Bradford Corridor, yet the Green belt between the two MDCs is at no great distance just there.

There is no sign of any committed and sustained co-operation between Leeds and Bradford despite the sensitive geographical adjacency of the green belt protected land that separates them. The Core Strategy fails to identify the process that has been followed to meet this requirement, either in the ongoing process of the formation of a Core Strategy or in the completion of its final form.

Also I can find no evidence of co-operation with health authorities and water companies or the environmental agency despite the increased health care challenges that would ensue from the Urban Extension, and the increased flood risk that would be brought to Pudsey Beck and Treggata.

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

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



Fleet Representation

This Plan has not sound because it has not been been positively planned - it hasn't been prepared based on a strategy which needs to meet objectively assessed development and infrastructure requirements.

My concern is about the parts of the Plan that show an urban extension at Holme Wood. As a resident of Tong Village this will adversely affect me because the numbers of houses planned are too large, the green belt land that will be taken is inappropriate and the lack of infrastructure planning will result in long term overload of the roads in and around Holme Wood. Bradford has not taken into account any of the objectives raised by local residents, both inside the area of Holme Wood immediately affected and those like us in the adjoining areas which will suffer from the inadequate thought that has gone into strategic infrastructure planning.

We were originally told that Bradford was planning for up to 7000 houses in Tong Valley. They reduced that figure in the consultations about the neighbourhood development plan for Holme Wood to 2700, but that figure is far too high. It is totally out of proportion to the number of houses planned in other parts of the Bradford District. Bradford has been planning this large number of houses for Holme Wood and Tong for at least 6 years and it has never given any serious consideration for the alternatives.

All the reports indicate that the biggest housing need is nearer to the City Centre. People want to be able to have easy access to their place of work. In Tong we have the greatest difficulty getting into Bradford because of the perennial road congestion, and I see nothing in the Plan that shows how Bradford are going to tackle the present congestion, let alone what would result from all these new houses. It is obvious that if Bradford builds houses right at the southern fringe of the City the new residents will not be going to work in Bradford and the others will not be people living in Bradford who want to continue working there. The Plan does not admit that.

I can't see how new satellite built right at the edge of Bradford are going to be sustainable without a lot of new infrastructure work being carried out in conjunction with Leeds via Kirkdean, and the Plan doesn't include any sign of that.

I am seriously concerned at the dangers that this reckless planning can bring about. Already it can take up to 40 minutes to get from Tong Village to our nearest Health Centre on Tong Street, and increase traffic up to an hour to get to the Bradford Royal Infirmary. It is quicker to get to the Leeds General Infirmary.

I understand that Bradford may be planning a pleasant development between Tong Lane and Railton Lane with only minor infrastructure at the start. That would be a disaster.

The rural road link road from Tong to Holme Wood are entirely unsuited to carrying the increases in traffic that would result from the urban extension, and further substantial traffic increases in Tong Lane through the Tong Village would be a nightmare - it is difficult enough getting in and out of the Village at rush hour as it is.

The Plan seems to me to be confused about how the traffic problem will be tackled. When the first neighbourhood development plan consultation took place and 7000 houses were possible we were shown an encyclopaedia top map with a link road marked up from Westgate Hill Roundabout on the A680 to Listerbyre on the A6177, and the next consultation said there would be an East Bradford Link Road, but this plan does not show it and at the last neighbourhood forum the local councillors said there would never be a link road and that all that was planned was some upgrades to Tong Street at the junctions and that would not happen for at least six years.

We don't want a link road because that would bring even more traffic into the area and would ruin the beautiful Tong Valley, particularly the ancient woodland at Black Carr Woods and the lovely trees woodland area at Holme Wood. It would also be an insatiable noise hazard for everyone both in Holme Wood and Tong.

Second Submission

The Plan is not sound because it is not justified - the plan should be the most appropriate strategy, when considered against the reasonable alternatives, based on proportionate evidence.

Green belt priority: The loss of green belt protected land should not take place unless there is no alternative. However I don't think Bradford has given serious consideration to the alternatives to losing the green belt land at Holme Wood. I read in the newspaper that the Minister of Housing thinks that Bradford should build twice as many houses as it is planning in the Canal Road area.

At the last round of consultation Bradford was able to find a lot of less sensitive green field sites around the district and said it was looking for more brown field sites yet we do not see any sign of this having been a priority with those who are making these proposals, and the numbers of houses planned for those areas have been substantially reduced in this draft whilst there has been no change to the plans for Holme Wood.

The fact that Bradford passed a resolution for the urban extension at Holme Wood two years ago means that it has not given fair consideration in this draft of the Plan to the alternatives, and that the consultation on the last draft of the Plan was a sham because the decision on strategy had already been made.

Set aside Council doesn't seem to have a Green belt policy and it hasn't set out in the Plan how it would want to continue the existing. I am appalled that Bradford hasn't done what Leeds has done to protect the green belt in the area surrounding Tong Valley. The Plan should set out a policy for protecting and enhancing the green belt in Tong Valley and for making the maximum use of this lovely countryside for the benefit of everyone in South Bradford and West Leeds.

There should be a clear strategy to develop countryside walks, to maintain and improve the paths and bridleways, to help the local communities, the farmers who produce their own beef and lamb in the Tong Valley and market it in their own shop, the dairy farmers and their ice cream parlour, the market gardeners, the livery and riding stables, the small businesses reliant on speedy transport.

The Plan is age working about this aspect of our District, and it should do so.

Third Registration

The Plan is not sound because it is not effective -- the plan should be deliverable over its period and based on effective joint working on cross-boundary strategic priorities.

There is no sign of any cross boundary agreement for the urban extension despite the enormous effect it would have on the roads, and the pressure on the schools and health services and other social and economic implications that such a development would have for Leeds and Kirklees.

I am also concerned that there was bad flooding in the Roker Lane and Towngate areas a few years ago, when one of my neighbours had his car swept away in the swollen beck. If the urban extension goes ahead at Flockton Wood I would want to know that all the authorities had considered the flood implications of all that surface water run off from 2700 houses at the top of the beck. There is nothing in the Plan that even suggests this might be a problem and no indication that this has been the subject of cross boundary working.

Also I know from experience that Leeds and Bradford have stopped working together over the management of the paths and bridle ways in the Tong Valley. Everyone who uses the footpath thinks that the Tong Valley should be integrated with the West Leeds Country Park, and when I first moved to Tong there was a joint Tong Cockersdale scheme, but Bradford pulled out.

We need more co-operation between authorities and less squabbling.

I find it confusing to understand Bradford's time table for the urban extension. At the first consultation we were told that it would come right at the end of Bradford's development plans, not until the Casual Road scheme had been finished. However reading the Plan, although Bradford says that the urban extension has the lowest priority, after brown field sites and smaller green belt releases, the Plan also says that the Urban Extension should be showing positive developments between year 4 and year 8 of the Plan. This is contradictory. The Plan needs to set out in clear terms when Bradford plans to release the land from Green Belt; otherwise the whole area is blighted with uncertainty for years to come and that will have a negative effect on the community.

Fourth Representation

The Plan is not sound because it is not consistent with national policy -- the plan should enable the delivery of sustainable development in accordance with the policies in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF).

I am concerned about Bradford's plans for the urban extension at Holme Wood as this seems to me to be a clear breach of the guidelines in the NPPD without any very exceptional circumstances to justify it.

There are two purposes of the green belt set out in the NPPD and this is how they affect the urban extension:

1. To Prevent the Spread of Urban Sprawl

Tong Valley is a green lung between Leeds and Bradford. The Green Belt is the only present structure controlling the growth of urban sprawl both between Tong and Holme Wood, and between the Metropolitan Districts of Bradford, Leeds and Kirklees. There is a good and effective natural boundary to the green belt provided by Worsgate Hill Street, Holme Lane and Ned Lane. The proposed sites and boundaries that we have been told about in the earlier consultation are arbitrary and largely indefensible.

2. To Prevent the Merging of Neighbouring Towns

Vital Lung: The green belt provides a vital喘息空间 (breathing space) between the neighbouring authorities. The threat of encroachment between Bradford and Leeds was why Leeds objected to the Tong and Holme Wood Neighbourhood Development Plan and the last draft of the Core Strategy and nothing has changed since. If Bradford reverts to its original plan for 7000 houses in Tong Valley there will be no gap at all between Holme, Tong and Pudsey, and Bradford have certainly been considering sites well down the Valley as well as those set out in the Neighbourhood Development Plan.

3. To Safeguard the countryside from encroachment

The current boundaries allow gentle access to the beautiful countryside within the Tong Valley. There are possibilities for this area to become more accessible and to allow a wide range of recreational activities apart from walking, such as horse riding, bird watching and other country pursuits. There is nowhere else in South Bradford that offers these opportunities. If Bradford goes ahead with a major new highway between Worsgate Hill and Threshbury this would further destroy important countryside, and threaten one ancient woodland at Black Carr Woods.

4. To Preserve the setting of Historic Towns

Tong and Pudsey are different but equally important historical settlements. The recreational benefit that they offer to the substantial number of visitors who benefit from them requires strong maintenance of the protection currently offered by the green belt land that surrounds them. Both are rightly identified as Conservation Areas, and both offer unique historical and cultural attraction within the largely urban life of West Yorkshire. Pudsey became the key settlement of the Moravian Community in the 18th century, and has retained much of its unique character. Tong is included in the Domesday Book; Tong Hall is a Grade One listed Queen Anne building; Tong Church is also Grade One, has Saxon and Norman origins, and has original 13th century fittings and furnishings from its rebuild in 1727 by leading Methodist preacher, John Nelson. Tong Village has a wide range of other listed buildings and features.

5. Recycling of derelict and other urban land.

My biggest concern is that if you allow the Green Belt to be used first then developers won't bother to use the brown field and other derelict sites in the City and Bradford will continue to need regeneration for decades to come. Our local councillors say that the developers have to be offered sweeteners to do any work at all on brownfield sites and that means they have to be offered greenfield sites as well to tempt them to the area. That is nonsense and it has to be us that the councillors have been deterred to too much sales pitch from the developers and have had too little regard to the important protections set out in the NPPD. The need therefore to maintain protection for the Tong Valley is vital to ensure that the regeneration areas of Bradford land that needs regeneration is given priority.
