MM18--....includes at least 84 hectares of new land currently not within the known supply.

1-- We do not understand why such a significant policy statement (84 hectares of Green Belt deletions) has not been justified, proven and tested cumulatively "in the round"-- to measure impacts on other policies.

To leave the review to the "Allocations phase" leaves out an importand strategic step. Publication at this point introduces significant risks, including that attached to Developers making presumptions about emerging "policy" We have in mind the Housing Minister's letter to Simon Ridley last year on the issue of prematurity.

Can Officers provide the analyses, studies, optioneering, risk analyses and testing which supports the decision to introduce these statements at this time.
