This MM can only be compliant once a sensible and feasible economic regeneration and development strategy for the has been developed. This would see, as a minimum:

- Recognition that economic strategy has to be tailored to the different areas that make up the District.
 What applies to the redevelopment of central Bradford differs enormously to that in the Wharfe valley towns.
- 2. Recognition that the towns in the Wharfe and Aire valleys depend on visitors coming to the town and development of any sort can only detract from the character of those towns. This will have an impact on economics and yet this hasn't been accounted for in the MMs.
- 3. The current economic strategy will generate an "Eastbourne effect" whereby older people will move to the area. Older people undertake very low levels of spending and yet they tend to cost the district a proportionately high amount in care. This will be intolerable for the Districts economy.
- 4. Thorough investigation of the area to the south west of Bradford that has multiple brown site locations where industry has moved out and the warehouse and industrial sites are now run down. This will spiral into an economic sinkhole. The cost of supporting the infrastructure in that part of the city will remain, but, the land will produce relatively lower returns per area of land. This is unsustainable.
- 5. Recognition that, under the current proposed strategy, older workers will be replaced by younger, less well-paid workers. This will impact on long term house prices which do not meet the expected house prices needed to sustain the high level of build across the district.
- 6. Recognition that parts of the Wharfe valley (like Addingham) have only limited infrastructure. This makes it highly likely that low wage earners will not be able to afford to move to the area and negate any sustainability of affordable housing in that village.
