MM28 redefines the SAC / SPA protection zones as A, B & C. The outer edge of Zone C being 7km from the SAC / SPA boundary. The HRA demonstrated this to be the radius from within which most visitors to Ilkley / Rombalds Moors emanated, frequently on foot. 15,300 new homes are now proposed within the 7km radius amounting to approximately 36,720 people (at an average of 2.4 persons per dwelling). Crucially the proposed new homes are in clusters which encircle the Moors on all sides. The HRA identified 28 access points around the Moors the vast majority of which are footpaths. It notes that "wet blanket bog" habitat is a key constituent of the SAC / SSSI and it is the most vulnerable in terms of trampling, the impact of dogs, draining (maintenance of grouse habitat) and fires (both wildfires and those associated with maintenance of grouse habitat). Natural England already classes the Moors as "Unfavourable, recovering". Blanket Bog is also a key habitat for wading birds including Golden Plover

which is a listed bird for the SPA. The HRA lists "visitor pressure" as a key threat to the condition of the SAC, SPA and SSSI and was the original reason why development numbers were reduced. They have now been increased in the belief that "visitor pressure" can be mitigated by the provision of "new recreational greenspace" and "Moors Wardens".

ACS believes that recreational greenspace provides a completely different outdoor experience to the Moors which are "nationally iconic", offering majestic elevated views, climbing, fell running, bird watching, unique fauna & flora and a sense of freedom. Many people move close to the Moors for exactly those experiences. Also Moors access points are so numerous, distributed right around the periphery and in many cases remote, that "new wardens" would have a very limited impact, especially as many are designated footpaths.

The net result will be significantly increased "visitor pressure" over the 15 year life of the Core Strategy and further degrading of a habitat which is already classed as "unfavourable". The proposed level of development and its distribution within the 7km radius is therefore "unsound" because the mitigation measures proposed will be largely ineffective in the context of Ilkley / Rombalds Moors.
