build 11,000 homes in a small countryside area which separates two cities without losing this function. There would be thousands of houses built on what was previously historic environment. Clearly no exceptional circumstances can justify such a blatant encroachment of the countryside.

- As National Planning Policy Framework point 88. Says "substantial weight should be given to any harm to the Green Belt." The inappropriateness of building on this Green Belt land is considerable (please go for a walk around it before making your decision) given the impact it would have on those living in Tong village, Fulneck, and that side of Pudsey. The National Planning Policy Framework is clear in its protection of Green Belt and the necessity to meet housing targets on its own is not enough to get rid or override Green Belt protection.
- This is not effective as it does not represent a joint cross boundary strategic priority. Indeed Cllr Mick Coulson of Pudsey, Chair of the Outer West Community Committee, said in an email to me "I have been fighting this development for 3 years, councillors objections went in 3 months ago".
- The Neighbourhood Development plan does not support Tong Valley being used for such housing as there is overwhelming public opposition to what has been proposed, indeed Stuart Andrew the local MP has also gone on record as being against this proposal. The selective review of the Green Belt is meant to be taken in consultation with local communities, but local communities have already spoken, it is a very clear 'no'.

In order for the main modification to be sound I suggest it be changed to:

Due to the lack of exceptional circumstances and due to local opposition there is no remit to build in Tong Valley as better alternatives are elsewhere, so the number of houses being built will be kept to SE 62, SE 051, SE 112.

Or at least a further period of public consultation is needed with local stakeholders, community groups and representatives before any changes to the Green Belt land can be made.
