



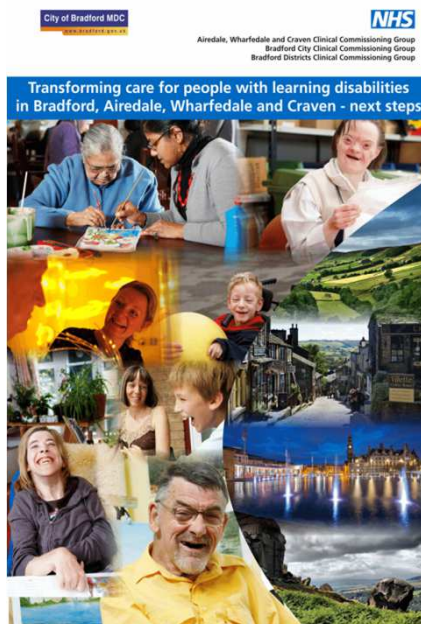

Service Gaps in Bradford District

1. Step up/Step down options.
2. People transitioning from forensic services.
3. People with complex presentation including people with Learning Disability and Autism.
4. People exhibiting behaviours that are a risk to themselves or others.
5. Sustainable crisis plans.

Skills Gap in Bradford District

1. Community Forensic Support.
2. Trauma Informed Care.
3. Personality Disorder.
4. Alcohol Foetal Syndrome.
5. Brain Injury.
6. Retention of staff - consistency in teams and approaches.

Supporting people to live happy, healthy lives at home both in control and able to make informed lifestyle choices for themselves and their families.



FRONT ACCESS

Connect to Support, Information/Screening/Self-Assessment/Navigation/Referral/Support Journey, BEST.

SUPPORTIVE TECHNOLOGY

Develop a number of services which enhance and support peoples access to and experience of services provision. Including Konnektis and Connect to Support.

MARKET ENGAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT

Working with existing and new stakeholders to provide training, support, service improvement and development opportunities. SIB an Provider Portal. Raising the industry profile with such initiatives as Unison Ethical Care Charter, further enhancing the existing market to support people to sustain, reduce or independently manage their care needs. Striving for 'Happy, Healthy and at Home'.

BRADFORD URGENT HOME SUPPORT SERVICE (BUHSS)

The development and implementation of Bradford Urgent Homecare Support Service (BUHSS) in two distinct areas of the District, this will afford peak period/winter resilience. Two organisations will provide the services for a period not exceeding seven (7) months, commencing 4 September 2017.

EXTRA CARE REVIEW

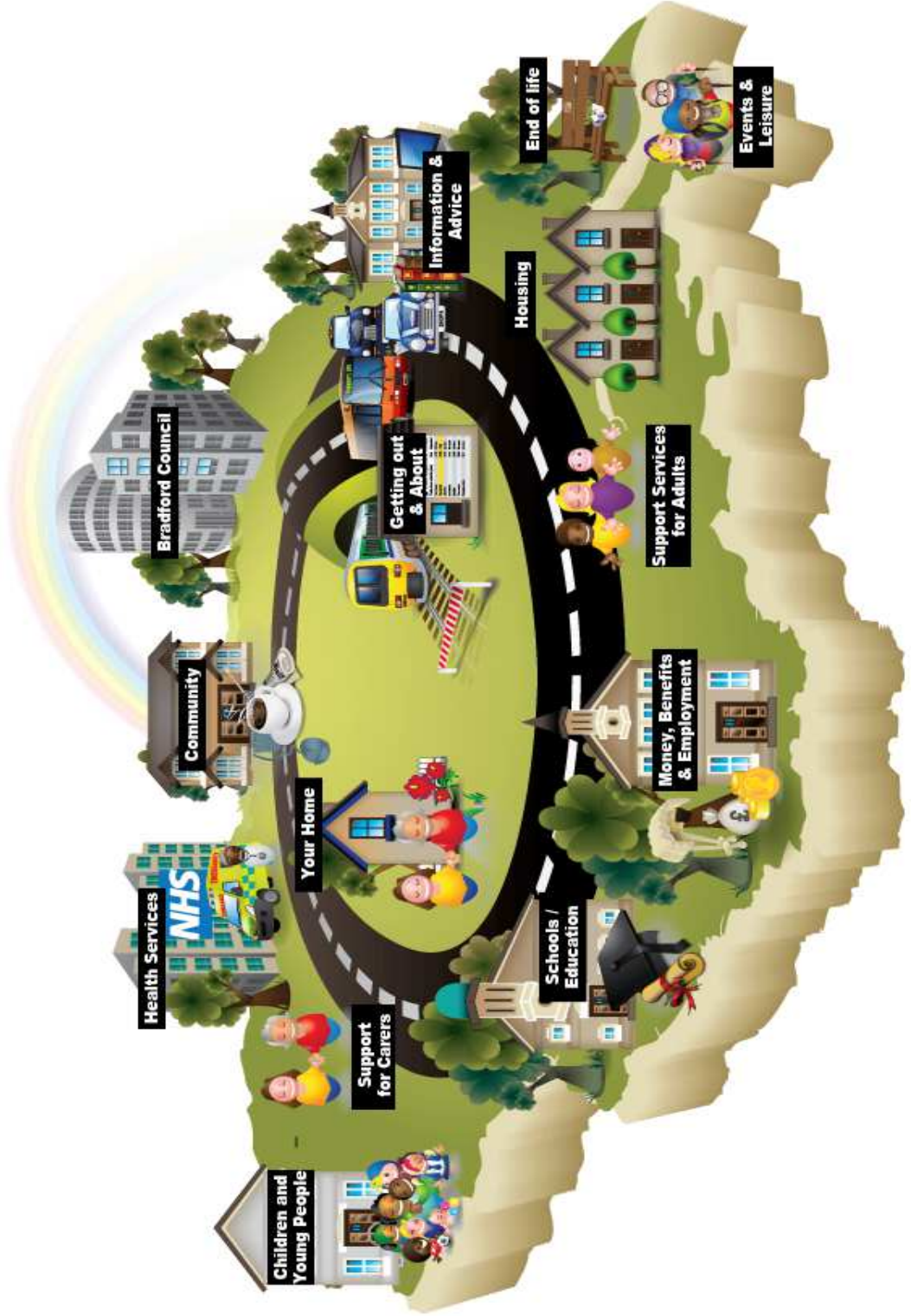
To review all existing arrangements in respect of EC provision, map future services and demand. Develop strategy for this area of provision in line with Home First.

NIGHT SUPPORT SERVICE

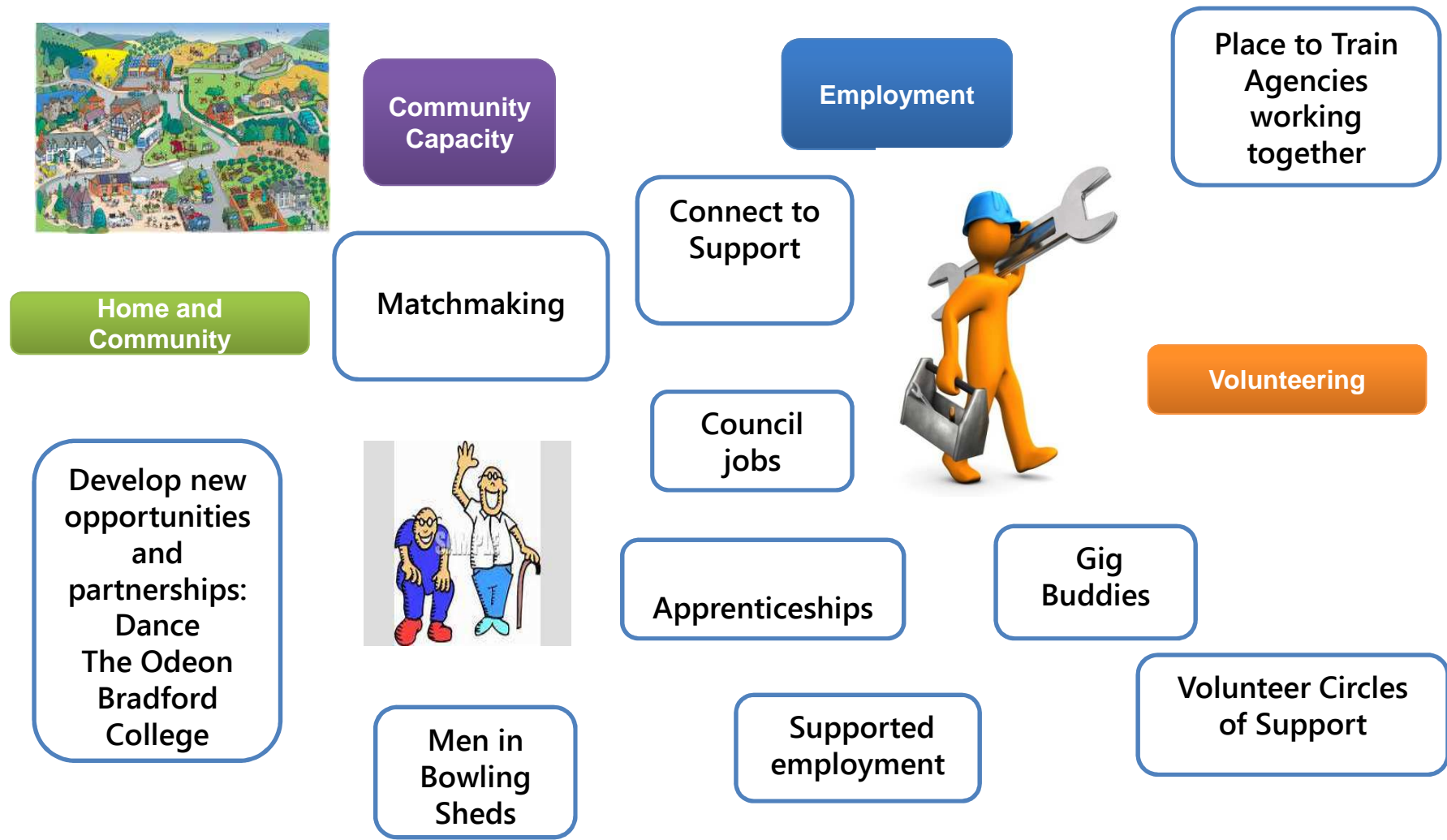
A practical support service to assist people's night care needs. This may range from individual one to one support and/or district wide 'roaming' service.

DEMENTIA SUPPORT SERVICES

The Development and Implementation of two distinct services. Service one, specific support to carers, supporting someone with dementia in their own home. Service two, a dedicated practical service for people and carers supporting people with dementia.
