	Is this the same as the Thornton strategy map?	Similar information presented (this example is for Ilkley). The plan work has involved building layers of information (using geographical information systems) to develop strategy maps for various parts of the District.
How should homes be built? How should homes be designed? Do you want flats or houses? Does everyone want to own a home?	I think there should be eco-friendly-homes, solar panel so people can save money on their bills.	The plan features a strong focus upon improving housing standards (policy HO9) and a move towards more sustainable energy use (policy EN10).
	Houses are unaffordable, the age of buying a house in going up, think we will be permanently renting	The delivery of more affordable housing is an important aspect of the plan and set out under Policy HO5 in particular. Some affordable housing options allow people to buy a partial stake or share in a property as well as provide a rental payment at a reduced scale appropriate to the value of the property. Government has also introduced measures to support first time buyers enter the property market and has consulted on other measures including 'First Homes'.
	There needs to be new ways to get young people on the property ladder who want to stay in Bradford.	Welcome further views on initiatives.
	Scared of not owning a home, renting a flat more realistic when look at affordability of housing. Agree with comments.	See comments above about affordable housing and interested in further views on meeting affordable housing needs.
	Eco friendly homes – environmentally motivated – as good a design to help the environment as possible.	Please have a review of the housing and environmental policies in the plan.

	Geothermal heating a possibility?	Yes – the Government's future homes standard sets out the requirement for heat pumps to be the primary heating system in new 'zero carbon ready' homes.
	Solar farms and wind turbines for future energy use.	The Council is currently undertaking a 'call for sites' for ideas in relation of locations for solar and wind technology.
	There is a high population of homeless people in Bradford perhaps more youth hostels for young people? Tackling empty home and the homelessness strategy to be looked at.	Tackling empty homes (particularly long term empty homes) has been a topic across a number of the online events. The planning team will be discussing further with housing colleagues and will also pick-up youth homelessness in more detail.

Not sure what types of jobs Struggle to find jobs, lower skilled jobs needed	Comments noted – the plan includes a policy focus upon linking jobs and skills development opportunities to new development (Policy EC3) and an overall focus upon supporting economic growth and development with a jobs target of 1600 per year.

In Shipley, for example there are so many cars, it is hard to cross roads, doesn't feel safe. I take the bus so could bus lanes be prioritised? It is a popular mode of transport.	The Local Plan includes a number of transport policy ideas to improve cycling, walking and public transport use. There are also current programmes to make places more people friendly including improvements to the public realm. Shipley is currently subject to Town Fund initiative. 	Need to look at affordability of buses, for younger people bus passes are a lot of money.	Comments noted ad to pick-up with transport planning colleagues. Some Councils / locations have introduced multimode (bus / tram / underground) travel cards, which can help make using public transport easier and in some instances more cost effective.
	Great Horton area would love to cycle but is very hilly. Need more cycle lanes. Would cycle in city Centre though where it is flat.	Comments noted – for some hills are a cycling challenge. The plan includes a focus upon new cycling infrastructure and route planning to encourage good take-up.

	More public bicycles, cost –effective such as free bikes. Park and Ride scheme/make more affordable.	Interesting comments and link to some ideas in the plan about new park and ride infrastructure. Some initiatives already in Bradford for low cost bike supply / ownership, but more could be explored.
