





Highlights – Local Plan



Highlights – Local Plan (Progress)

- Local Development Scheme update July 21
- Extensive work plan post Reg 18 consultation
- Revised Regulation 19 plan structure
- Internal and partner working groups meeting around specific action plans (housing and economy; environment; infrastructure; development management and transport).
- Senior level discussions on strategic matters including macro housing / employment numbers issues and strategic sites – alongside supporting further technical work
- Briefs worked up for landscape evidence, site access / accessibility updates, Southern Gateway, urban capacity analysis, waste.
- Reg 18 representations individually summarised
- Technical evidence work progressing ecology write-up; heritage impacts; site accessibility (TRAC), whole plan viability tendered and appointed (Aspinall Verdi); transport evidence tendered, evaluation undertaken and clarification stage in progress, Micro masterplan work.



Highlights – Local Plan (work going forward)

- Publish representations online through Opus Connect.
- Finalise final batch of key commissions.
- Review call for site submissions and undertake site visits.
- Updated site assessment and technical work
- 1st run working list of Regulation 19 allocation sites to feed into updated evidence material.
- Duty to Cooperate ongoing linked to sites and technical work upates
- Further directions on updates to the planning system and housing number calculations?



Representations



Representations - Overview

- Individual representations 29,559 from 5911 individuals / bodies.
- 2 petitions Ilkley and Keighley.
- use of consultation system 20:80 split (using / not using)— still vast majority of comments received via e-mail.
- Will review experience or users and look at how to improve systems going forward to increase active use of the consultation software.



Representations – Headline Analysis

- Responses to the plan tend to reflect previous observations strategic policies and linked 'hot issue' policies (housing for example) – large number of representations.
- Sites representations and opposition mainly structured around sites which stimulated local campaigns – low levels of comments in many of the Bradford Urban areas
- Reviewing response on sites and further work on delivery







Highways COVID-19 Response

Extra space for social distancing

- Emergency Transport Policy work
- Providing more safe space to walk and cycle
- New pop-up cycle facilities
- Relieve pressure on public transport

Pavement Licences

- Expedited Outdoor Seating Licence process
- Safer mixing in outdoor space
- Bradford had highest number of successful outdoor seating applications in Yorkshire.





Active Travel Fund

Together ATF 1 and 2 make up £2.5M investment in new walking and cycling infrastructure in Bradford District.

ATF 1 (Completed)

- Pop-up cycleways
- Parklets
- School Streets

ATF 2 (Underway)

- 3 Active Travel Neighbourhoods
- Additional pop-up cycle facilities in South Bradford and Bingley
- Footpath improvements





WY+ Transport Fund Schemes

Hard Ings Road Keighley

- Highway widening to relieve congestion north of Keighley
- Bottleneck on A650 route
- Completed and received John Smeaton Award for best practice

Harrogate Road New Line

- Reduce congestion and improve journey times for all modes
- Works underway to complete Spring 2022

Bradford Forster Square Station Gateway


 To transform the station to provide a modern, high quality facility with covered waiting areas.

Corridor Improvement Programme

Work to improve junctions on the Outer Ring Road (A6177) to improve bus journey time reliability and introduce active & sustainable transport modes (walking & cycling)

Phase 1 Schemes -

- Thornton Road / Cemetery Road
- Gt Horton Road / Horton Grange Road (start on site early 2022)
- Thornton Road / Toller Lane

Phase 2 Scheme -

Cutler Heights Lane / Dudley Hill

A641 Bradford Huddersfield Corridor

- Improvements to junctions and cycling facilities in Bradford
- Scheme has just been to consultation

South East Bradford Access Road

 Reduce congestion and unlock development

Bradford to Shipley Corridor

 Reduce congestion and prioritise sustainable transport

A650 Tong Street

 Increase capacity and improve walking and cycling provision







Transforming Cities Fund Schemes

4 Major Transformational Schemes in Bradford City Centre

City Centre Cycling & Walking

- Doubling the pedestrianised area in Bradford City Centre
- Creating many more traffic-free streets which are safe for cycling
- New public transport corridor with enhanced bus facilities at 'bus hubs'.

Bradford Interchange Station Access

- High-quality pedestrian access to the Interchange from City Park
- Better links between buses and trains
- Improvements to the Interchange interior







Transforming Cities Fund Schemes

Manchester Road P&R and Bus Expressway

- Bradford's first purpose-built P&R site
- Manchester Road converted to high-priority median bus lanes
- High-quality cycle facilities





West Bradford Cycle Superhighway Extension

 High-quality cycle facilities linking Bradford City Centre and Thornton





Southern Gateway

Bradford is developing a Development Framework for the *Southern Gateway*.

5 Key Moves (right) are identified to maximise the opportunity brought by a new through station.

- Over 1.86 million sq.m of development floor space
- Over 100,000 jobs (similar to the Olympic Park and Stratford in London)
- Minimum of 2,500 new homes







Mass Transit

Significant work ongoing with WYCA to establish case for Mass Transit

- Will bring high-quality public transport
- Modes not settled on but include tram
- Four routes in Bradford:
 - Bradford Leeds
 - Bradford Dewsbury
 - Bradford Halifax
 - Bradford Airport
- Will form a basis for regeneration with development anchored around stops
- Delivery from 2025 onward







Emerging Transport Strategy

- Replacement Transport Strategy currently in development with consultation on proposals in 2022.
- Scheme identification and Prioritisation likely to focus on:
 - · Health and Wellbeing
 - Clean Growth
 - Place and Environment
- Response to Climate Emergency will drive scheme priority.
- Clean Growth likely means:
 - Focus on road space reallocation to increase capacity
 - Sustainable freight with more rail + zero-carbon last mile
