Bradford Council is responsible for commissioning some of the sexual health services in the Bradford district.

Our current contract with the people who provide these services is coming to an end soon.

To make sure we carry on providing the right services to meet people's needs we want to know what you think.

What you tell us will help us to plan sexual health services for the future.

What is sexual health?



Sexual health is about enjoying safe and happy sexual experiences without anyone suffering emotional or physical harm or being forced into doing things they don't want to.



It means feeling good about your experiences and not regretting anything.

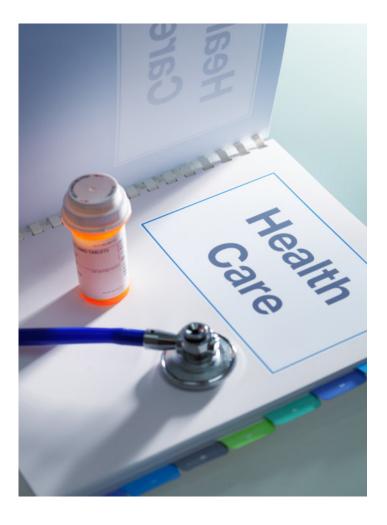


It's about practicing safe sex.

This means using contraception to stop getting pregnant if you don't want to.

It's also using condoms to help protect against sexually transmitted infections (STI's).

Sexual health services in Bradford



Bradford Council provides the following sexual health services:

- Contraception and advice on unplanned pregnancies
- Sexually transmitted disease (STI's) testing and treatment
- HIV testing
- Sexual health specialist services including young people's services, outreach and promotion
- Support for teenage parents
- Chlamydia screening
- Referrals to services that provide additional support to people who may need it.

The NHS provides the rest of the sexual health services in Bradford.

Our plans



To help us with our plans we looked at information about sexual health outcomes in Bradford.



We also engaged with people including those who use our services and provide them.



We looked at the things we need to keep because they work well and worked out what needs to change so people can have better outcomes.



We also worked out our priorities.

These are the things that are most important for us to work on.

They include:

- Getting more people to use contraception that is effective
- Making sure that we can diagnose more STI's earlier through digital and postal services



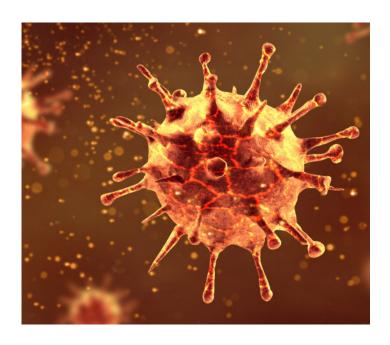
 Providing better access to services for people who are high risk or vulnerable



 Reducing the number of abortions that people have.



What we found out from our review



During Covid more sexual health appointments were offered over the phone and online.

There were postal and click and collect services for contraception.



These were very popular and we think we need to keep them and develop them further.



Some key services are not easy for everyone to access because of the location they are in.

It would be better if these services were available online and in the community.



Some people may need additional support and we need to find better ways to reach them.



More people could be using the most effective contraception methods like implants and intra-uterine devices.



Chlamydia is the most common STI among young people.

We believe there are more young people with chlamydia than are being diagnosed.

What we think should change



We think we need to:

 Have a greater focus on making digital options, like online appointments, easy for everyone to access



 Offer more services in community settings and through primary care



 Have better links between voluntary organisations and sexual health services













 Less difference in service accessibility and performance between district areas.

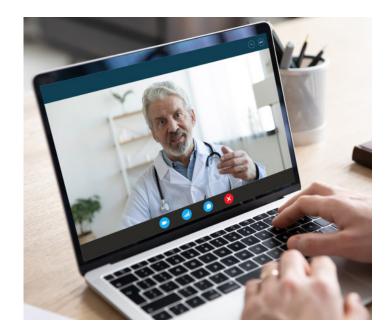
