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



What the data tells us

- Nationally an increase of 26% people in contact with mental health services at the end of March 2023, compared to March 2021 *1
- Nationally one in six children and young people now have a probable mental disorder, up from 1 in 9 in 2017 *2
- Homeless demand: most common needs are due to offending behaviour and mental health
- Projected shortfall of 120 supported accommodation units over next 10 years
- Issue of unmet need
