It shows what we plan to do over the next 4 years.


The Council Plan looks at improving:

Due to the coronavirus pandemic we need to look at how we can continue to meet our plan and do the things that we have said in the previous plan.

#### **Our District**



Bradford Council works together with others to deliver services to the many people who live in the District.

Over 8,000 people work at the Council and most of them also live in the Bradford District.



It is made up of the city of Bradford, the large town of Keighley and lots of smaller towns and villages.

The Bradford District is the fifth largest Metropolitan Local Authority District in England.

Lots of people who live here are young and it is very diverse.



This means there are lots of people from different backgrounds and cultures.

Over 10 million people visit the District every year from other places in the country and world.



We are very proud that Bradford and District has been voted as the best place to start your own business in the UK.

Another study shows we were voted as the most improved city in 2019.



The district also has many successful businesses such as in food, engineering, chemicals, technology and things that we use everyday such as gas, electric and clean water.



Public services and voluntary and community groups have always worked well to bring communities together.

We do however face some big challenges. Some of them are:

# Poverty



There are lots of people living in Bradford who have very low incomes.

There are some very poor areas and many children who live in poverty.



People who live in the richer areas live longer than people who live in the poorer areas.

People in poorer areas are not as healthy as people living in richer areas.



This means there is a lot of demand for public services for people who live in the poorer areas.

# Connectivity



We need to do more to connect Bradford, Shipley and Keighley to other places by good transport.



**Education and Skills** 

Bradford is the largest city in the UK not on a mainline rail station.

It takes too long to travel between all parts of the District and to travel further north.



The skills and qualifications that our children receive have got better but for older people they haven't.

This still needs improvement.

Resources



It is hard for the Council to raise income locally.

This is because many households are on lower Council tax bands than in other parts of the country.

# Living with COVID-19 (Coronavirus)



Over the last few months the coronavirus pandemic has meant we have all had to deal with extra challenges and work in different ways.



It has affected many of the people who live in our District, including those who are already living in poverty and the elderly.



We are concerned about the young people who live in our District and their health.

We are also worried about any changes this may have made to their future chances of getting good jobs and life opportunities.



The way we deliver council services and the way we work has changed since lockdown.

A lot of our staff are now working from home. Instead of actual face to face meetings we are having live video meetings.

#### Our Priorities Priority 2 - Decent homes




Our ambition – this is what we want to happen.

We want all children and young people, from all backgrounds to have the best education they can.




Some of the things we will do are:
